The Pupil teacher is evaluated by two faculty members of neighbouring institute/ BEO/ Head of the Institution other than parent institute. All the Pupil teachers of the Institute are involved in the process.

#### 2. Goal(Objective):

The objective of the 'best practice' is to improve the quality of the Practice teaching and also to point out and rectify defects, if any, so as to make the teaching more effective

#### 3. The context that required initiation of the practice:

The young Pupil-Teacher gets good opportunity to share the experience of senior academicians in practice teaching. This will help them to develop good teaching skills. The weakness or defects, if any, can be rectified. The overall performance of the Pupil-Teacher can be improved. A cordial relation among the stakeholders can be developed.

#### 4. Practice:

Each Pupil Teacher at least two times during the practice teaching evaluated by the peer. The Pupil teacher is evaluated by two faculty members of neighbouring institute/ BEO/ Head of the Institution other than parent institute. All the Pupil teachers of the Institute are involved in the process. During the peer evaluation observations are noted in the Daily Lesson Plan dairy for improvement if necessary.

- c. To enable teachers to frame flow charts for curriculum transaction.
- d. To enable the teachers to develop a deep insight into various needs of students.
- e. To develop management skills in the faculty members and timely execution of activities.

#### 3. The context that required initiation of the practice:

It is observed that the monitoring of curriculum transaction in different sections of class is necessary for the Head of the Institution. There is need of a mechanism to monitor the progress of curriculum transaction by the faculty is upto the mark or not. For this purpose Annual Teaching Plan mechanism is adopted by the Institution framed by the IQAC.

All faculty members completed their syllabus on time and record is maintained by the institution.

#### 6. Problem encountered

No major obstacle faced to adopt this practice.

#### 7. Resources Required

Printed prescribed Dairy designed by the IQAC is provided by the Institute.
